Intro.....

As you begin to learn *North Shore*, try to work on the left hand fingering. This will give more of a challenge than the actual playing of the notes themselves. Try using your pinky on the middle string in measure 4. Your thumb should play the middle string in measures 5 and 6. The biggest challenge comes in the 2nd measure of the B section where the middle string is fretted at 2 and then slides to 1. This is probably best accomplished by using middle finger to slide while holding down the bass string at 3 with the thumb. You can then use the ring finger to play the remaining notes that occur on the melody string. Remember, your playing style may lend itself to different fingerings. Experiment to find the best fingering for you.
